

COTATI AT WORK



Old Redwood Highway Gateway Project



If you've been on Old Redwood Highway lately, you can't miss the changes underway at the gateway to our city. Thank you for your patience as we build continuous sidewalks on Old Redwood Highway, but the best is yet to come: Entry plazas, landscaping, streetlights, new crosswalks, bike lanes, and street furniture. Work in the roadway is expected to be complete in

July. This project includes a \$1.1 million federal grant.

Highway 116 Landscaping

Soon, you will see the long-awaited landscaping installed on Highway 116 around the US 101 interchange. This includes new trees in the tree wells, and landscaping in the median island on Highway 116. This project includes a regional grant.

Falletti Pathway Project

You may have noticed that there has been a lot of work going on at Falletti Ranch, at the corner of West Sierra Avenue and East School Street. When this project is finished in July, there will be new fencing and pathway, including a new picnic area. Come visit the picnic area this summer, and we look forward to continuing to open up parts of the ranch for your use!



Sidewalk Accessibility Upgrades

We are wrapping up the last of these projects to improve access, including new curb ramps around the Gravenstein Way neighborhood, new sidewalk on La Plaza and West Cotati Avenue next to La Plaza Park, and some upgrades to the sidewalk on West School Street and Clifford. These important projects will make our sidewalks more accessible for everyone. These projects include over \$288,000 in federal grants.



Old Redwood Highway South Rehabilitation (Coming Soon!)

This summer, work will begin in our Downtown (Old Redwood Highway, between La Plaza and Page Street). We are repaving this section of roadway, and will be improving the crosswalks. This project includes a \$250,000 federal grant.

City Lifts Water Shortage Restrictions

Due to increased rainfall this past winter and easing of State drought regulations, the City has lifted the water shortage restrictions. Together we exceeded the water reduction goals during the drought! Please continue to use water wisely and take advantage of our FREE water conservation programs, which can be found on the City's website at cotaticity.org/wc.
