



Watch City Council Meetings Live Via Webstream

The Cotati City Council meets on the 2nd and 4th Tuesdays of each month generally at 7:00 p.m. in the City Council Chamber at Cotati City Hall, located at 201 West Sierra Avenue. If you can't make it, it is easy to engage with your City by using the Meeting Portal found at www.cotaticity.org. Simply click the Audio/Video link and watch the meetings live, or watch them later on demand.

Water Meter Upgrade

Over the next several months, you will receive a notice about a city-wide water meter upgrade project that is underway. When complete, this project will allow the City to closely monitor the City's water distribution system for leaks, before they would normally be visible. In this period of on-going droughts, this will allow us to quickly make repairs and make Cotati one of the most efficient distribution systems in the state. In turn, this helps avoid or postpone costly water system projects that would be needed to deliver more water. The contractor will be letting you know when they will be there to minimize any inconvenience.

Truck Ordinance



On August 25, the City Council adopted an update to the truck route ordinance prohibiting large trucks from using Old Redwood Highway between La Plaza Park and the southern City limits. This is a response to the continual heavy truck traffic passing through the downtown and the associated noise, dust, and resulting road damage. By state law, some categories of trucks are exempt and can continue to go off of designated truck routes, including deliveries/construction within Cotati, garbage trucks, buses, and emergency vehicles. Once the ordinance goes into effect, you may notice a quieter more peaceful downtown!

Old Redwood Highway Gateway Project
